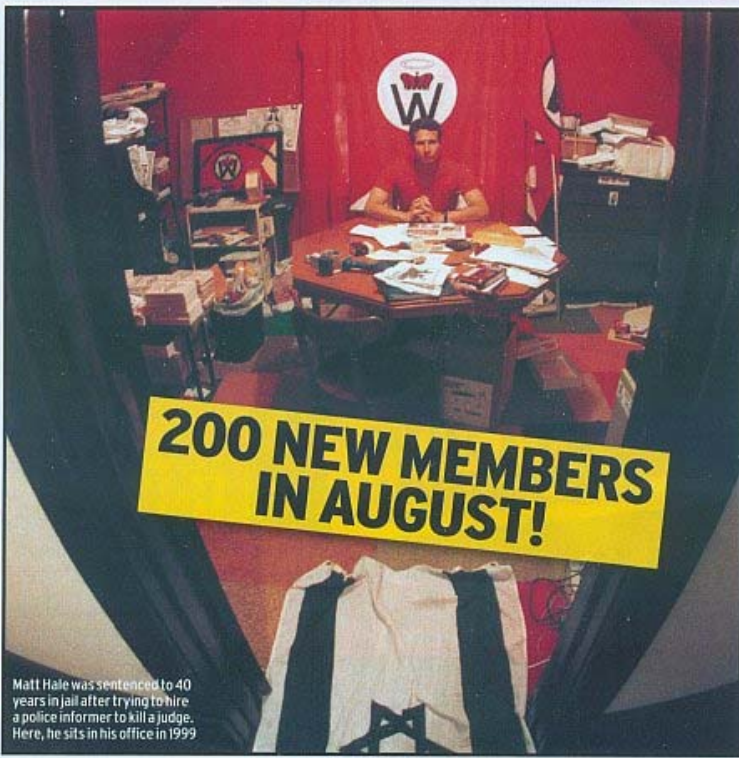
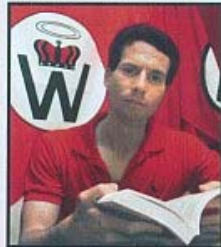

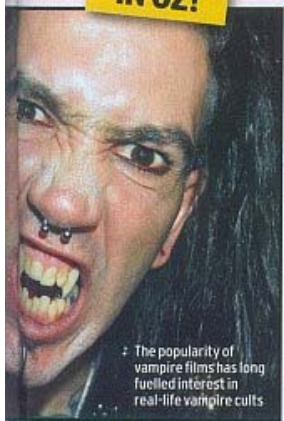

## 8 JEFFREY LUNDGREN'S MORMON SPLINTER GROUP

Originally a member of the Mormon Church, Lundgren formed his own sect of 20 people in 1984, convincing them that he was "God's last prophet". He moved his congregation into a share-house in Ohio, demanded their life's savings and promised they would soon witness the second coming of Christ. When one of his followers, Dennis Avery, refused to hand over all his savings and move his family in with the group, Lundgren convinced the others that they had to kill a family of five if they wanted to see God. Conveniently, the Avery family had five members, and all five, including Avery's wife, two teenage daughters and six-year-old daughter were bound, gagged and shot dead by cult members. Despite his execution in 2006, Lundgren's mental brand of Christianity lives on, spreading all the way to Australia, where some extreme Mormons practise his teachings, including the belief that Jesus visited America.
